She had a special way of making everyone feel taken care of. She was a quiet, humble, and sweet woman. She had a gentle and loving spirit. She always made time for her kids and grandkids, except when her favorite soap opera was on, then the TV had her full attention. Thank goodness Days of Our Lives was only for 1 hour.

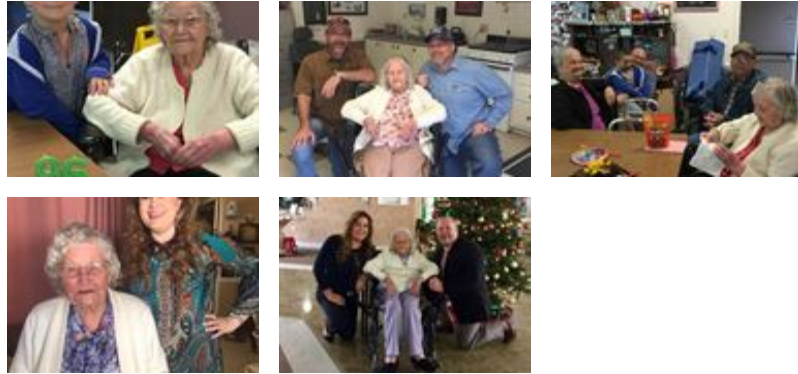

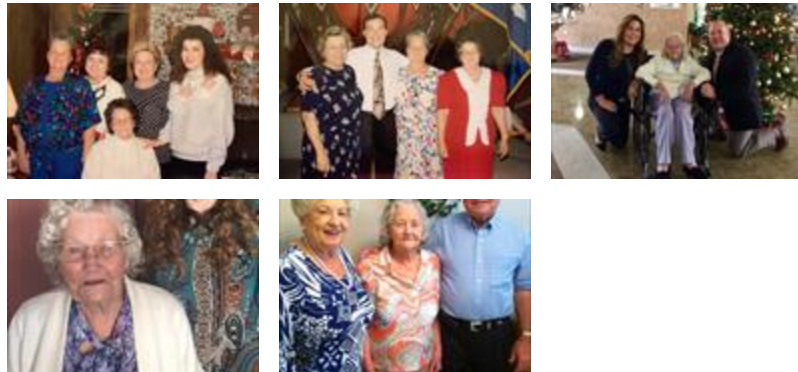
