When I first walked up to him and told him I was there to look at the apartment, he said that he couldn't rent to me because I was too young to rent a place. I asked him how old do you have to be to rent one of his apartments? He said at least 18 years old. I said well I will be 19 years old on September 14th. And that was just about 4 days away at the time. And he didn't believe me. He said little girl, did you run away from home? I said run away? He said, yes did you run away? I said now I am 18 fixing to be 19. He still didn't believe me. I gave him my driver's licenses, I had to give him my birth certificate, and my social security card. He said that I looked like I was only 12 or 13 years old. I followed him around town for a week till he finally rented me the apartment on Porter street. He said I was one of his best tenants that he ever had. Then he would come to the apartments to see if I wanted to help him paint or something. He just wouldn't believe that I was almost 19 years old. He said there was no way that I was fibbing about my driver's licenses. But, after that we became good friends. He was the best landlord I have ever had besides him thinking that I ran away from home. He always was there to fix anything that was wrong and he would always come by at least every other day to make sure everything was alright. And now today landlords do not care about nothing all they want is the rent. They are not worried about anyone or their places that they rent.
