Major Clarence Mosby, 93, passed away on Sunday, January 20, 2013, in San Saba. Visitation was held on Wednesday, January 23, 2013, from 5:00-7:00 PM at Heritage Funeral Home. The service is being held at 10:00 AM on Thursday, January 24, 2013, at Heritage Funeral Home with interment following at San Saba Cemetery.

Clarence was born on January 27, 1920, to George and Ethel Mosby in Grandview, Indiana. He married Juanita Busby on August 1, 1941, in Goldthwaite, Texas. He enlisted into the National Guard in 1940. Then he was commissioned into the Army in 1946. While serving he was awarded the American Defense Service Medal; American Campaign Medal, Asiatic-Pacific Campaign Medal; World War II Victory Medal; Army of Occupation Medal (Germany); 4 Overseas Service Bars; and the National Defense Service Medal. He retired from the service in 1961 with 22 years of service. He then joined his family in San Saba .

He was an avid sportsman in that he enjoyed fishing, hunting, golf and other activities. While living in San Saba, he was a member of the masonic lodge, Rotary Club, and served as an elder in the Presbyterian Church. He enjoyed gardening and was known as the "spoiler " of grandchildren.
