“ Diana fought lung cancer for four years. The cancer, chemo and radiation treatments wreaked havoc on her system. Diana always went back for more. She was constantly fighting debilitating weakness and peripheral nerve damage. The cancer metastasized to the spine, ribs and the brain. She endured numerous trips to the ER due to infections and required numerous blood transfusions. All to no avail. Finally she suffered a broken rib on the left side right next to the sternum resulting in excruciating pain upon movement. Initially it was thought to be cardiac in nature but proved to be the broken rib when she was given a CAT scan. She was discharged from the hospital and taken home by ambulance. She spent the last two weeks of her life at home being taken care of by myself with the aid of hospice nurses and CNAs. The last 24 hours of her life she was not more than minimally aware of her surroundings. Diana told me numerous times that she was tired of the battle but I always did my best to boost her spirit to keep her going. 3 weeks before her passing Diana told me " I can feel that I going soon" "I am sorry that I will be leaving you".. After 56 years of marriage, I miss Diana terribly. Everything around our home that I touch and see reminds me of events with Diana. I still think of everything in terms of "us" and "we" Half of me is missing. I feel empty inside. I try to keep busy to keep my mind occupied. I am relieved that Diana is not suffering anymore, but, there is an emptiness at home and in my heart that will never be filled.

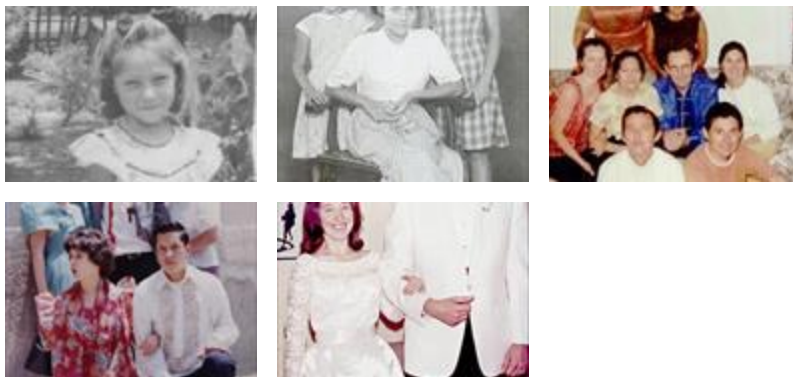
