August 31, 1919 - August 13, 2013

Frances Grobe, age 93 of Menard, passed away Tuesday, August 13, 18 days before her 94th birthday.

She was born August 31, 1919 to Marion S. Whitley and Alice Striegler Whitley in Concho County. She graduated from Menard High School in May 1936 and John Tarleton College in 1939. She was a reporter for the Menard News, a teacher at Clear Creek School, a teletype operator for the Santa Fe Railroad, a posting machine operator for Bevans State Bank in Menard and was an Executive Secretary with the Selective Service Local Board No. 110 in Sonora from which she retired on July 1, 1973 after 20 years of service. On October 21, 1945 Frances married Ed Grobe of Junction and they had a daughter, Peggy Lynn Carnahan of Houston.

Frances was preceded in death by her parents, her husband Ed, brother Malcolm Whitley and sister Anys Godfrey. She is survived by her daughter Peggy, son in-law Craig Carnahan, sister Hazel Menzies, her special cousin Rusty Williamson, a large number of nieces and nephews and a lifetime of wonderful friends.
