



## Harold Wayne Anderson

December 3, 1946 - July 5, 2014

Harold Wayne Anderson, 67, of Tulsa Oklahoma, and formerly of Brady, Texas, died July 5, 2014, at his home.

Family visitation will be Thursday, July 10, 2014, from 6-8 p.m at Heritage Funeral Home in Brady. Services will be held in Brady, Texas at Heritage Funeral Home Chapel, on Friday, July 11, 2014, at 10 a.m.

Burial will take place at Bethel Cemetery, Camp Air, in Mason County immediately after the Funeral Service.

He is preceded in death by his parents and his brother, Larry Anderson of Seguin, TX.
