July 26, 1926 - October 7, 2015

Jane Armstrong was born on July 26, 1926 in Caldwell, Texas to Arvel and Vallie Johnson. The family then moved to Mason, Texas where Jane graduated from Mason High School. After graduation Jane moved to San Antonio and worked as a secretary. While in San Antonio, her most exciting experience was going to lunch at the Menger Hotel where a famous actor at the time, Victor Mature, opened the door for her. While living in San Antonio, Jane also met a life-long friend, Gwen. Set up on a blind date by Gwen, Jane met Felix Armstrong. They would marry October 1, 1949 and move to Menard. Their first daughter Terry was born in 1950 with their second daughter, Felicia, arriving in 1951. At that time, Texas was in the midst of a great drought, so in September of 1951, Felix and Jane, along with Felix's parents, relocated to southeastern Oklahoma, where they operated a sheep and agriculture ranch until 1960. Returning to Menard after the death of Felix's father, Jane worked for the Menard School District and then for Don McDonald at his Wool Warehouse. She would later work as a bookkeeper for Jamie and Carlton Kothmann at Kothmann Commission Company, where she retired after more than 25 years. After retirement, Jane began watercolor painting and donated many paintings throughout the years to local organizations and painted greeting cards for the Menard Manor residents for many years.

Jane was preceded in death by her husband, Felix, her parents and her two sisters, Louise and Lucille. She is survived by daughters, Terry and Felicia,

her almost-niece, Suzanne Young, one nephew and two great nieces and two great nephews.
