Julian Rudy Rogers, 79, of Lampasas, Texas, passed away peacefully on February 11, 2026.

Born on August 19, 1946, to John N. Rogers and Regina Mejia, Rudy was a lifelong resident of Lampasas. He loved his hometown deeply and built a life rooted in faith, family, service, and community.

Rudy proudly served his country in the United States Marine Corps, enlisting on November 18, 1965. He attained the rank of E-4 Corporal and served as a Rifleman (0311). During his honorable service, he was deployed to the Republic of Vietnam, where he served his country with courage and dedication.

For his bravery and sacrifice, Rudy was awarded the Purple Heart Medal (2 Awards), National Defense Service Medal, Vietnam Campaign Medal, Vietnam Service Medal with 2 Stars, Good Conduct Medal (First Award) He was honorably released from active duty on August 17, 1967, after having proudly completed his tour of duty.

Following his military service, Rudy remained devoted to his faith and community. He was a faithful member of St. Mary's Catholic Church and was actively involved with the VFW and the American Legion. His service to his country continued in spirit through his support of fellow veterans and community organizations.

An avid outdoorsman, Rudy enjoyed hunting and fishing and cherished the quiet beauty of the Texas countryside. Many fond memories were made outdoors with family and friends, sharing stories, laughter, and traditions that will carry on for generations.

He is lovingly survived by his son, James D. Rogers and wife Veronica of Goldthwaite, Texas; and his daughter, J. Michelle Rogers of Lampasas, Texas. He was a proud grandfather to Ethan Rogers; Derek Rogers and wife Samantha; Aidan Vega; and Trinity Mangan and husband Donnavan. He was also blessed with one great-granddaughter, Emilee Mangan.

Rudy was preceded in death by his parents, John and Regina Rogers; his brothers, Joe David Rogers Thomas Rogers and John Rogers; and his sisters, Janie Monroe and Mary Wilson.

Rudy will be remembered for his steady presence, deep patriotism, devotion to family, and unwavering faith. His legacy of service - to his country, his church, and his loved ones - will endure for generations.
