Loxie met the love of her life, Bobby Huffstuttler, at the local Burnet Tasty Treat in the summer of '69 (yep - go ahead - sing the song!) after graduating from Burnet High School that same year. They sealed the deal on Friday, May 15, 1970 in a lovely service surrounded by their family and friends at the First Baptist Church of Burnet. We could not be prouder of our parents for always standing by each other's side.

She was happiest when her family was all together. She was so proud of both of her children's accomplishments and those of her grandchildren and great grandchildren as well. If you ever sat with her for even just a few minutes, she would tell you so - whether you wanted to hear it or not - and we hope you liked to look at her pictures, too. She sure did love that - just like her momma did.
