Mary Carol Dotson went to be with the lord on Saturday, December 2nd, 2017. There will be a celebration of her life at a later date.

Mary was born on December 26th, 1928 in San Francisco, California to her father Sophus A. Olson and mother, Nellie B. (Anderson) Olson. She was the first out of six children to be born.

Carol married Olen Childs in Carlsbad, New Mexico on December 30th, 1950, at the age of 22 years old. They lived together in Fort Stockton. Olen had one son, James Allen (Jimmy) Childs, before marrying Carol. Together they had one daughter, Carolyn Sue (Suzie) Childs. She was a member of the First Presbyterian Church and attended regularly. She married Jesse Dotson in 1998. Jesse had an accident and was ill in 2012, which prompted a move to Brady to live closer to Suzie. Jesse passed away in 2013. Carol lived just over the last year of her life at Brady West Rehabilitation and Nursing Center where she enjoyed playing lots of Bingo and listening to music by the Bluebonnet Gang, Mason Singers and

others with her friends, Mary Lou Bird and Hazel Manor, among others. She also became a member of the Brady Presbyterian Church and attended regularly.
