Stanley Claire Frazier passed away at his home in Menard, on May 10, 2013 at the age of 68. Stanley was born in Fort Stockton TX on October 26, 1944 to Johnnie Newton and Lillie Patton Frazier.

He graduated from Menard High School in 1963 and in 1965 entered the United States Army. After a year of service stateside he left for Vietnam. He served with the 630th Ordinance Company in Cam Ranh Bay, Tuy Hoa, and Qui Nhon. While serving overseas he was awarded 1 Company Commendation, the Vietnam Service Medal with 1 Bronze Star, and the Republic of Vietnam Campaign Medal.

Stanley never met a stranger and could talk to anyone for hours; he always went out of his way to help anyone in need. He was a member of the Menard Volunteer Fire Department for over 20 years, as well as a volunteer with Menard Emergency Services. He loved working outdoors, hunting, and most of all fishing.
