



Thomas C Womack

July 30, 1927 - May 21, 2015

Thomas C. (Tom) Womack passed away on Thursday, May 21, 2015 at 87 years of age. Tom was born in Ballinger, Texas on July 30, 1927 to Clarence and Johnnie Mae Womack. His father was a school teacher and rancher, and his mother was a homemaker.

Tom graduated from Goldthwaite High School and attended Texas A&M University. He served in the U.S. Navy and received an honorary discharge.

Tom married Donna Jane (Polly) Stubblefield on December 4, 1948 in Goldthwaite, and the couple made their first home in Sonora before settling in San Saba in 1952. The couple had three children, Nancy Jane, Thomas Wayne and Robert Ray.

Tom was a faithful member of the Church of Christ, and worshipped at the Second and Wallace St. congregation since moving to San Saba.

Tom's first career was as a wool and mohair buyer, and he worked in this industry with Hollis Blackwell in Sonora, San Saba, Goldthwaite and Brownwood. During the height of his career in the wool and mohair business, he traveled extensively throughout the United States. Tom purchased the Texaco distributorship in San Saba in the early 1970s, and he continued as the distributor for the San Saba area until the early 1990s. Following his

career with Texaco, he began his association with Dean Bagley as a pecan broker, and he was involved in the pecan business until his death. Throughout his life, Tom was also active in the livestock industry and was an avid cattle buyer.

Tom is survived by his three children, Nancy Womack of Brownwood, Wayne Womack and wife, Mary Jo of Brownwood, and Robert Womack of Abilene; two grandchildren, Shele Sanderson and Scott Sanderson of San Saba; and two great grandchildren, Cooper and Sloan. He was preceded in death by his wife and two sisters, Virginia Finlay and Mamie Lou Campbell.
